At least four times during the year, school groups will walk the mile armed with gloves, bags and vests supplied by the city to pick up litter along the sidewalks and roadway. "This partnership is a great example of Collegiate's commitment to our neighborhood community, and link to global concerns," said Head of School Scott Prince. "Preserving our neighborhood and teaching environmental habits

will leave a legacy and inspire stewardship."

A pick-up date is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, March 29, which coincides with Operation Brightside's community-wide clean-up date.

Second Annual Shotgun Festival in the Works

Festival was held in July 2007 on the site of the old trolley turn around at Ellison Avenue and Swan Street. LAVA House Fire

On the night of January 26, a fire broke out at 927 Shelby Parkway destroying the home of artists' collective the Louisville Assembly of Vanguard Art, and claiming the life of resident Bill Christie. Many artists lost works of art and supplies in the fire. Three people who lived there lost everything they owned. A total of nine studios were destroyed.

According to the LAVA House Web site, "Several Glassworks employees were victim to the fire. They did not make it out with anything - no car

keys, no IDs, not even shoes. One particular employee lost his dog in the fire." The 13,000-square-foot facility, known as LAVA House, was owned by artist Glenn Herre.

Photographer and nearby neighbor Clifton Salas captured an eerie image

of the fire that night and another of the aftermath the next morning.
