
## Portland Festival Building To Host LAVA House Halloween Gala

Nearly 300 patrons are expected to visit The Portland Festival Building located at 34th and Northwestern Parkway for the 4th Annual Halloween Art Show and Concert on Saturday October 30 the from 8:00 p.m. until 2:00 am sponsored by the Louisville Assembly of Vanguard Art (their working studios are located in Germantown on Shelby Parkway.)

LAVA artists have been in discussion for several months regarding opportunities for them in Portland and Shippingport and were looking for a new venue to host their many events throughout the year. 
The LAVA artists have a bag full of talents and shared resources ranging from Photographic, Metal Shop (Casting and Fabrication), Stone Carving, Figure Model Drawing, Welding, Ceramics and Kiln, Stained Glass, Power Tools and Saws, Web Design, Video Production and Multi Media Presentations.



The Lava House mission is dedicated to creating a stronger more prosperous community through the arts by promoting venues for artist expression, independent film making, music shows and meeting space for groups advocating positive change and projects.

LAVA artists have offered to design a work of art for the festival building and are offering ideas for its restoration.


